AOPA's AIRPORT WATCH

What is GA SECURE and TSOC?

A toll-free national government hotline (1/866-GA-SECURE, or 1/866-427-3287), has been in operation as part of the Aircraft Owners and Pilots Association's (AOPA's) Airport Watch program.

• Provides a fast, easy means for reporting and acting on information provided by America's 560,000 pilots.

AOPA

- Staffed 24/7 by the TSA's Transportation Security Operation Center (TSOC).
- Based on the information a pilot gives them about a possible threat, they will contact all the appropriate authorities in that airport's local community, or state and federal law enforcement agencies as needed.



What to Report:

In all cases involving critical and immediate incidents or threats, contact 9-1-1 local Emergency Dispatch.

- Suspicious activity or type of incident
- Date and time
- Aircraft registration, or "N" number, or airport location
- Physical appearance of suspicious person(s) (gender, height, clothing)
- Other relevant information

TSA's Layers of Security Approach

20 layers of U.S. Aviation Security

- 1. Intelligence
- 2. Customs and Border Protection
- 3. Joint Terrorism Task Force
- 4. No-Fly List and Passenger Pre-Screening
- 5. Crew Vetting
- 6. Visible Intermodal Prevention and Response (VIPR) teams
- 7. Canine
- 8. Behavior Detection
- 9. Travel Document Checker
- 10. Checkpoint/Transportation Security Officers

TSA's Layers of Security Approach

20 layers of U.S. Aviation Security

- 11. Checked Baggage
- 12. Transportation Security Inspectors
- 13. Random Employee Screening
- 14. Transportation Security Specialists-Explosives
- 15. Federal Air Marshal Service
- 16. Federal Flight Deck Officers
- 17. Trained Flight Crew
- 18. Law Enforcement Officers
- 19. Hardened Cockpit Door
- 20. Passengers

General Aviation Airports

According to the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA), currently there are 19,633 airports that can be accessed by the General Aviation community.

- General Aviation airports are the largest single group of airports in the U.S. airport system.
- Georgia has 95 General Aviation airports.
- Airports in Georgia (excluding Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International) support:
 - 1.2 million annual boarded passengers.
 - 720,000 commercial service visitors.
 - 1.1 million general aviation visitors.
